




Geography

Along the Pyrenees mountain range, it borders France and the tiny principality of Andorra (N-E)





Cuisine

Mediterranean Spain – all such coastal regions, from Catalonia to Andalusia: heavy use of seafood, such as pescaíto frito; several cold soups like gazpacho; and many rice-based dishes like paella from Valencia and arroz negro from Catalonia

Inner Spain – Castile: hot, thick soups such as the bread and garlicbased Castilian soup, along with substantious stews such as cocido madrileño. Food is traditionally conserved by salting, like Spanish







Ingredients:

- Dissolve the sugar with evaporated milk Ideal out of fire

- Add the condensed milk Nestle thin threads
- Tampere yolks with hot milk and add in strings moving strongly
- Add vanilla

- Strain and distributed in containers served to the third party.

Preparation of merengue

- Prepare the syrup in a pan with sugar and water
- Do not use a spoon to make the syrup
- Beat the egg whites until stiff and add the hot syrup into thread point directly from the pot or pan and continue beating until the meringue cool (to avoid cutting)

- Spoon the meringue over blancmange around the container.




Basketball, tennis, cycling, handball, motorcycling and, lately, Formula One are also important due to the presence of Spanish champions in all these disciplines.




