A Brief History of the School

The church known under the name of Nicoritza, founded by Nicoara Hatman, lies on one side of the Tatarasi Hill, in Iasi.

For more than one century this church was used as school for girls and its name was 'The Girls ' School Number 1'.

During the World War I the school belonged to the Army.

From 1959, all the school documents mention another name for this school, as Primary School Number 10.

In 1971, School Number 10 had a new building and from 1994 it is known as 'Gh. I. Bratianu'School.

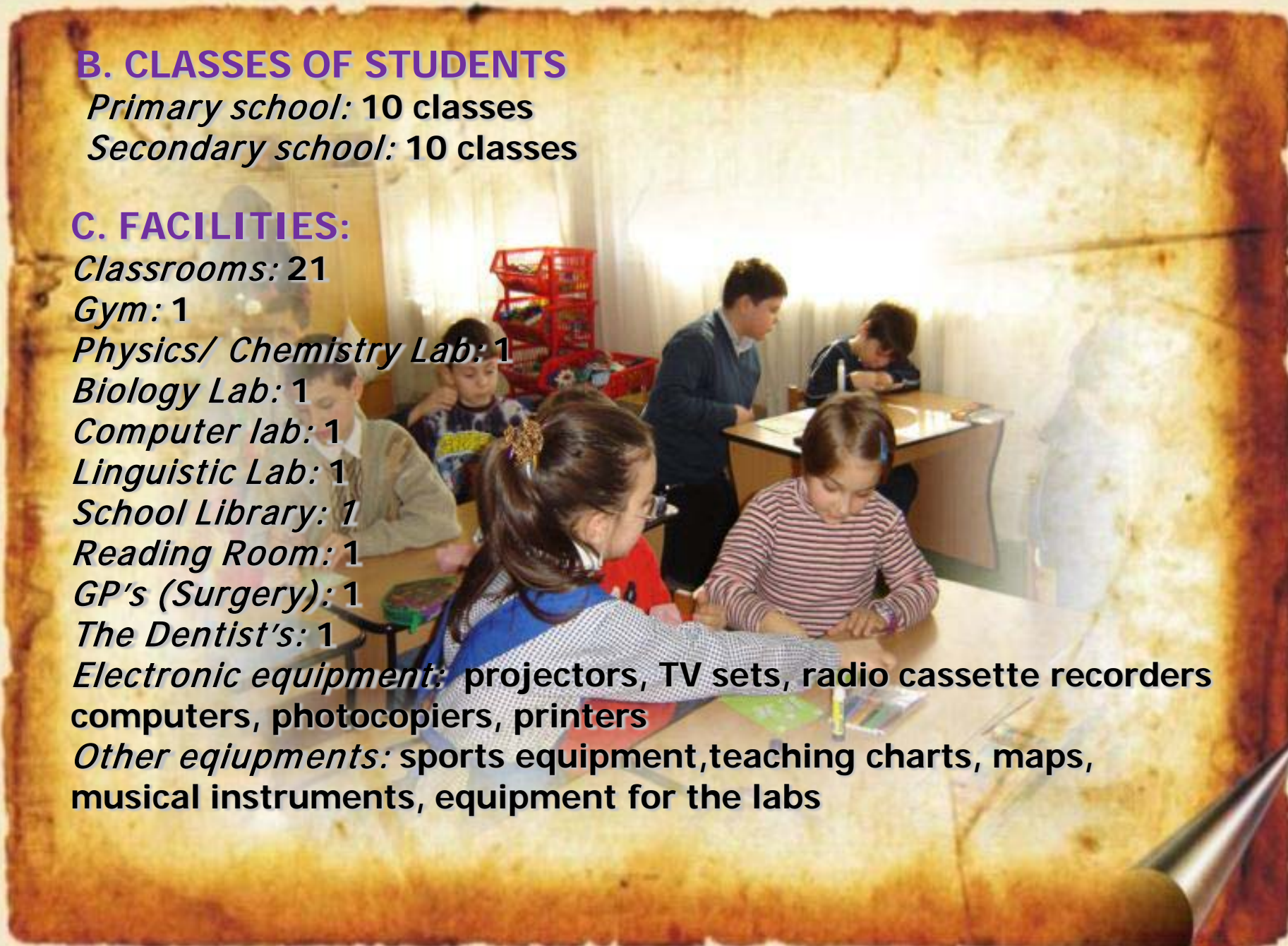

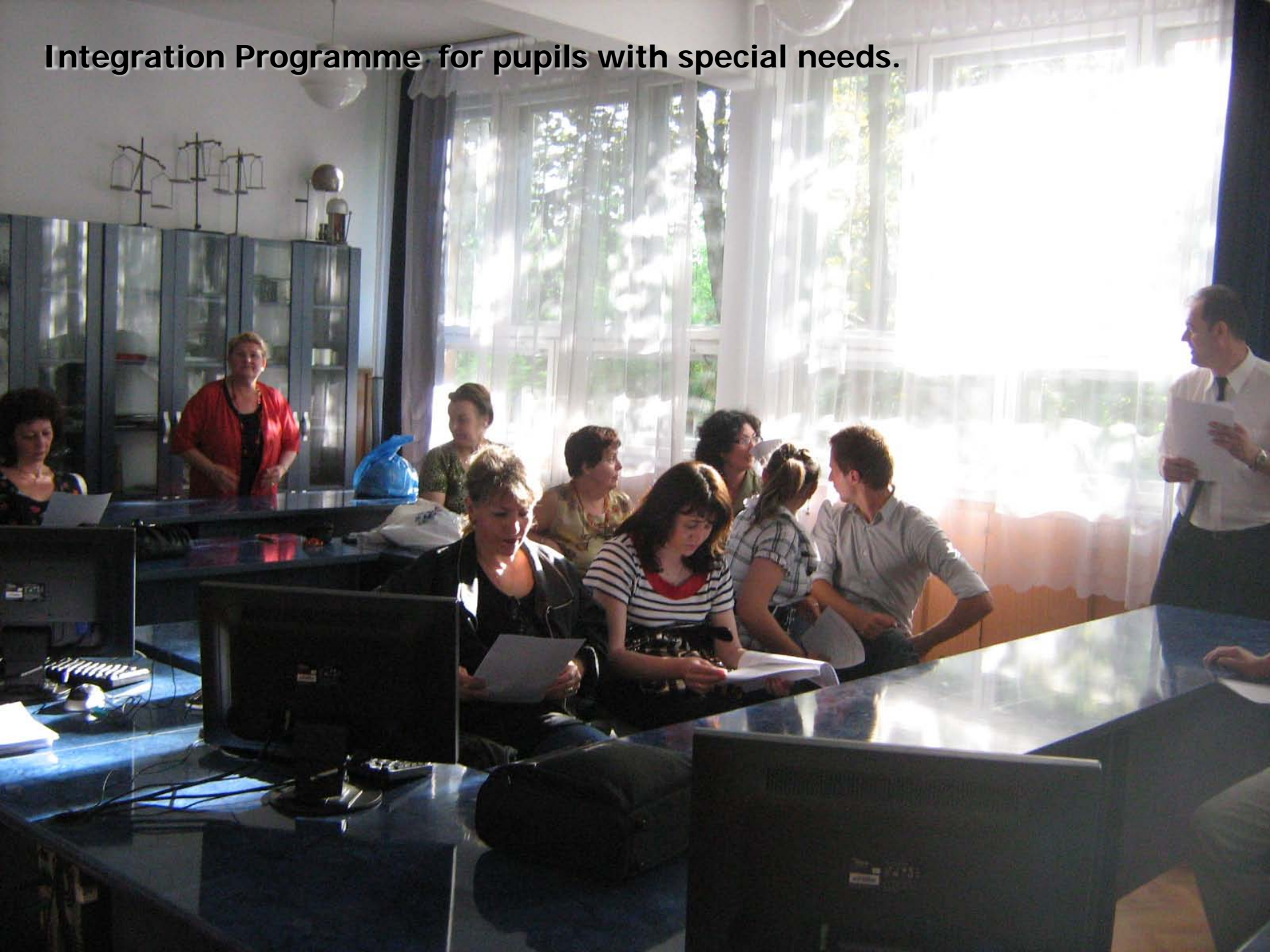

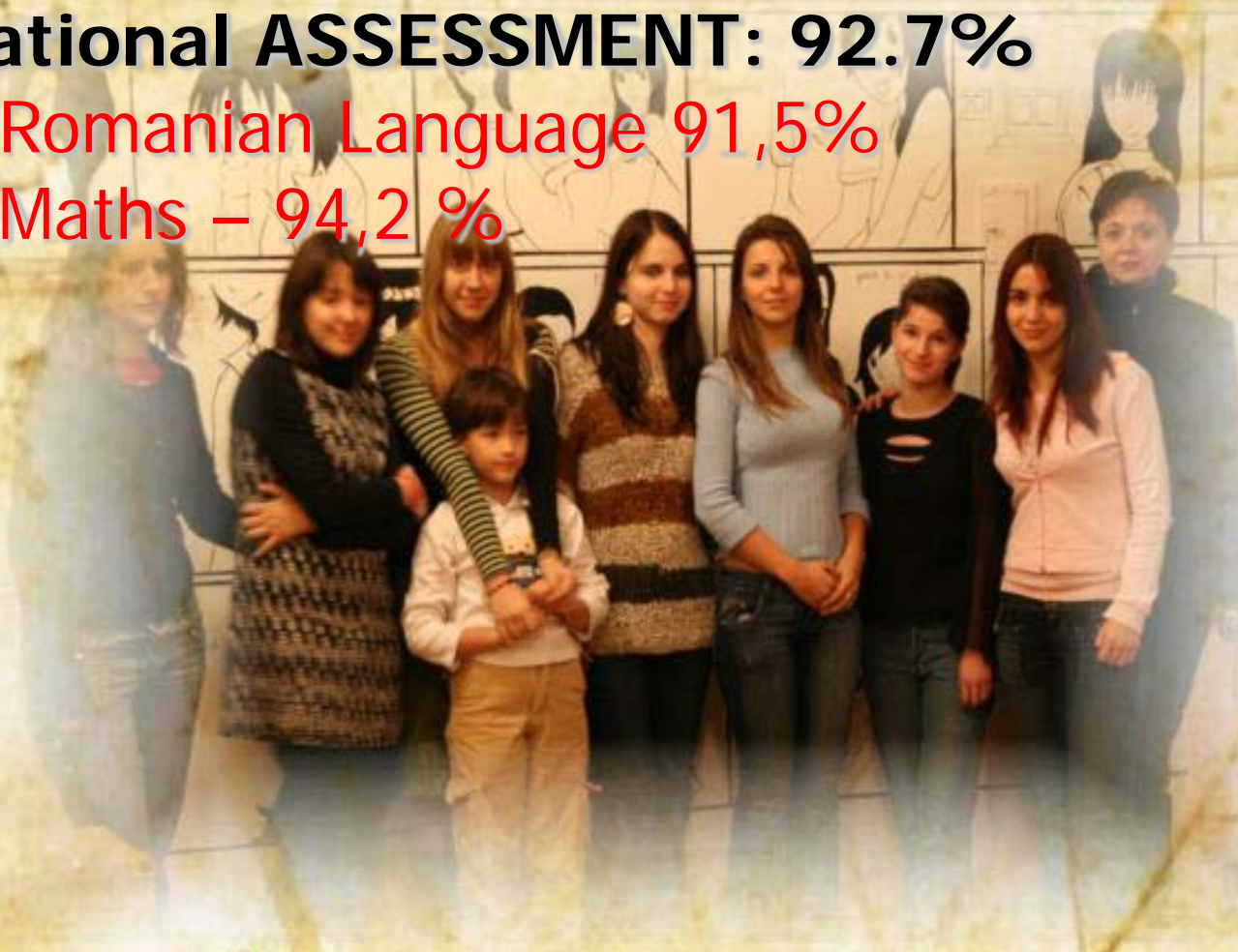

The educational system structure in Romania

- Primary education: I-IV grades
- Secondary education: V-VIII grades
- High-school education :IX-XII grades
- High-school lower cycle (IX-X grades) or vocational education

Targets and Purposes

- Within the framework of the National Curriculum, **our school is free to plan and organize teaching and learning in the way that best meets the needs of the pupil**
- Teaching is not just the transfer of knowledge but also drawing out students' nascent capacities.
- A school, however, is not primarily an economic organization; it is primarily a cultural organization. The purpose of school is not to generate wealth as a business but to unfold human capacities as a center of learning. Place schools in the service of economic goals and we begin to undermine the purpose of schooling. Instead, the best way to prepare students for economic and political life is to develop in them capacities of judgment and discernment, and this is what we need to assess.

- High school students need to have their abstract thinking challenged, their powers of discrimination exercised, and their confident and meaningful participation in the world encouraged. At puberty, critical thinking, scientific investigation, and rigorous thinking are crucial.
- Elementary school children need to have their imaginations stimulated through storytelling and artistic work. A life rich in inner imaging holds the key to learning during these years. This is the phase of emotional development.

- School must be a safety place for students.
- Development of linguistic and communication competence.
- Pupils' access to the modern technology.
- Partnerships with CJAPP, CCD, Al. I. Cuza University, C. P. unescu Special Needs School, Tatarasi Cultural House and other institutions from our community.
- Teachers' possibilities to participate to different courses and projects.

- Teachers and students' professional development in team work, concerning civic education to cultivate citizens to participate in the public rights of a democracy, to use their rights and to discharge their responsibilities with the necessary knowledge and skills
- The learning activity should be focused on class teaching.
- Extracurricular activities are very important for students' free time: Drawing Club, Dance Club, Chess club, Ballet Club, Sports Club.
- Encourage the intercultural activities and educating students for communication.
- Students with special needs should be integrated in school activities and education.
- Projects in Voluntary Activities

The necessity of the intercultural dimension of education is imposed in our school by:

- the elimination of prejudices and stereotypes
- migration of parents
- the presence of diversified ethnics in our city or in the surroundings
